






Principal's Message






Use of Technology






Truth & Reconciliation






Practical and Applied Arts (PAA)

Once every six-day cycle, we combine with Macdonald School in Stockholm to offer a variety of PAA programs for. Students in grades 7/8/9 are transported to and from Macdonald School on a school bus during regular school hours.

Course offerings vary each year, but past programs have included: Financial Literacy, Design Studies, Cooking, Construction, Outdoor Education, Coding and Robotics, and Sewing

This collaboration provides students with diverse and hands-on learning experiences that enrich their education and prepare them for future opportunities





Band Programing

All students in Grades 5 to 9 take part in our band program, which follows the Saskatchewan Arts Education curriculum. The program is designed to support students' musical growth through performance, music literacy, and cultural appreciation.

In **Grades 5–6**, students are introduced to the fundamentals of

In **Grades 5–6**, students are introduced to the fundamentals of music, including instrument care, proper playing techniques, and reading musical notation. Emphasis is placed on developing good tone, rhythm, and ensemble skills.

In **Grades 7–9**, students continue to build their skills by studying music theory, exploring a wider range of musical styles, and performing more complex pieces. Focus is given to expressive playing, musical interpretation, and understanding the structure and elements of music.







Canteen

Our school offers a daily canteen, proudly run by our Grade 6–9 students. Snack options vary throughout the year based on availability and popularity, and all items are prepackaged. We aim to keep prices low, with all items rounded to the nearest \$0.50. Along with snacks, we also offer drink options like milk and juice boxes, as well as main items such as Pizza Pops and corn dogs.

The canteen is cash-free. Students can purchase \$5 or \$10 canteen cards through **MySchoolCash** or by bringing money in \$5 or \$10 increments to school.



Microwave Schedule



To help avoid long lines and make sure everyone has time to eat, we follow a microwave schedule. This ensures all students get a fair chance to heat up their lunch and ensures we have adequate supervision for students while they are eating.


Hot Lunch
